

Ethics, Morals, Character, Discipline, Self-Discipline – Definitions from the Dictionary

Ethics - The study of ideal human character, action and ends.

Morals - Characterized by excellence in what pertains to practice or conduct -social regulations - virtual and action.

Character - moral figor of firmness, especially as acquired through self-discipline; the aggregate of qualities belonging to an individual.

Discipline - training which corrects, molds, strengthens, or perfects. Control gained by enforcing obedience or order.

Self-discipline - correction or discipline of one's self for the purpose of self-improvement.
